The Mission is situated at Ibex Hill near the American Embassy, about 4 km east of the city centre and about 20 km from the airport.





Who is Gossner Mission?

Gossner Mission was founded in 1837 by the German Reverend Johannes Evangelista Gossner (1773-1858). Gossner was Roman Catholic from birth and ordained as a catholic priest before he converted to the Evangelical Lutheran Church.

The first missionaries were sent to Australia. Since 1845, Gossner Mission has been very engaged in the north eastern part of India.

In 1969, Gossner Mission was called to Zambia by the first Republican President Dr. Kenneth Kaunda. The work started in the Gwembe Valley where Gossner Mission supported the Tongas in their new settlements.

Projects in Zambia

In the Gwembe Valley agriculture and irrigation, schools, hospitals and churches were in the focus of Gossner activities until when in 1998 the **Kaluli Development Foundation** was formed for administrative self autonomy. Gossner Mission is still a member of the board of this independent NGO and supports the management and special projects like the Gender Equity Promotion Project.

The **Naluganda** community near Lusaka has been supported by Gossner Mission since the mid 1980s. Various trainings in agriculture and management were offered, boreholes drilled, preschools constructed and the teachers paid. The preschools have now been handed over to the government. Gossner Mission still supports single projects of the women network.

Gossner Mission has several guest houses located in a park like environment.

Rooms



The guest houses can host 18 people in one to three bed rooms. Most of the rooms are self-contained.

The guest houses are equipped with kitchens where guests can prepare their meals.
