

Who is Gossner Mission?

Gossner Mission was founded in 1837 by the German Reverend Johannes Evangelista Gossner, a Lutheran pastor who had the first protestant hospital built in the capital of Berlin.

In 1969, Gossner Mission was invited to Zambia by the first President of the young Republic of Zambia, Dr. Kenneth Kaunda, to assist the people in the Gwembe valley after they had been displaced during the construction of the Kariba dam.

Our Mission is supported mainly by church members and individual donors in Germany, moreover by churches and congregations and for a couple of years by the German government. Since the mid-seventies Gossner Mission has served as a base in the capital for development workers in the country but it is also **open to visitors of the general public**.

Our guest rooms are situated in a lovely, silent, park-like environment close to the city. We can host up to 18 people in single to three bed rooms, most of which are self-contained, and there is a self-catering kitchen available to all guests, breakfast is offered on request. We have two self-contained cottages (3 and 4 beds) with an individual kitchen.



An open “**insaka**” provides **space for some 20 people** for workshops, trainings and other events. Workshop material (flip chart, beamer, screen etc.) is available. We offer full board and / or snacks to our workshop participants. The “insaka” can be hired with or without renting accommodation.

We work on a **non-profit basis** and provide jobs for a staff of ten. We maintain the good standard of the family-friendly premises and the beautiful garden and try to be environmentally friendly with solar energy providing for our electricity and hot water, the five chickens laying fresh eggs for breakfast and the kitchen garden providing our guests and staff with nutritious vegetables.
